

Global Hunger Snapshot

- ❖Growing Hunger
 - ❖45 million people in 43 countries are on the edge of starvation.
 - ❖This is the world's worst starvation crisis for children in a generation.
- ❖Why? ("four "Cs")
 - **❖**Conflict
 - **COVID**
 - Climate Change
 - ❖Cost of food is rising
- ❖Where? Worsening hunger is concentrated in some of the world's hardest to reach, most dangerous places. It's an "invisible crisis."

Acute food insecurity is increasing further

- Early 2020 pre-COVID-19 (people, in millions)
- November 2021 estimate (people, in millions)¹

Ukraine Crisis Impact

- ❖ 50% of WFP grain used to be sourced from the Black Sea Basin.
 - Impact on distributions to populations in need across the Middle East and Africa.
- The WFP estimates the distribution costs increasing due to commodity and fuel prices.
 - -\$71M a month, resulting in \$9B deficit for FY22.
- Some areas, change of modality from food distribution to cash.




Food Security Forecast

❖ Food insecurity is projected to worsen in the coming year

Due to funding shortages and growing needs, World Food Program (WFP) is being forced to make ration cuts


WFP has listed 20 countries, called "hunger hotspots" where hunger will deteriorate if more is not done





Afghanistan

- Near universal hunger over 90% of population does not have enough food.
- Population is adopting negative coping measures, skipping meals or more extreme measures.
- World Vision is distributing food, providing emergency nutrition and running mobile health clinics reaching more than 231,000 people, with support from WFP and USAID/BHA.



East Africa

World Vision

- ❖ 509,000 people in East Africa are under famine classification (IPC Level 5)
- ❖ The rainy season has failed three years in a row – and the drought continues.
- Northern Ethiopia Tigray reached famine levels
- We know from past emergencies, such as the 2011 Somalia Famine in which some 258,000 people are estimated to have died, that around half perished before a famine declaration was made.



World Vision is responding to the impact of hunger in six countries in East Africa and requires US\$ 209 million* to reach 7.1 million people, including 3.4 million children.

Fragility in the region is acute.

Continued conflict in Ethiopia, protracted conflict in South Sudan, Sudan and Somalia threaten human and economic development sains.

COVID-19 aftershocks ripple through communities with declining income opportunities, lost livelihoods and diminished purchasing power.

Poor rainy seasons in parts of East Africa region have resulted in below-average crop production, poor rangeland conditions, and rising cereal prices

World Vision's Global Impact

Hunger is growing.... but we know how to turn the tide.

- Last year alone, World Vision ran 365 food projects in 29 countries, providing assistance to 12 million people (58% of which were children).
- ❖ Our work also helped to feed 684,000 children under 5 years old, and 173,000 pregnant women.
- Over the last 10 years, 89% of the severely malnourished children we treated made a full recovery.

Changing weather conditions destroy crops when they are almost ready to be harvested, after months of hard work and investment. This frustrating situation demands resilience, and the women of South Sudan are rising to the occasion!

They have joined a World Vision programme that teaches communal farming and provides women with the equipment they need to flourish.

"When I heard about the project, I was initially reluctant but my situation forced me."

The women of Sudan now farm as one. They describe the process as "empowering", and their yield has increased.

"Now, my joy has no bounds."

45 million people in 43 countries across the globe are at risk of starvation with 584,000 already living in famine-like conditions, and the remaining 44 million at grave risk of falling into famine. 

HUNGER SUPPLEMENTAL - MAY 2022

Meeting Goal: Member supports at least \$5 billion in supplemental funding for international food assistance accounts in response to the global hunger crisis.

Long-Term Goal: Member displays increasing leadership to support US foreign assistance. Member and staff know World Vision and feel supported and accountable to make decisions that honor God and reduce global poverty.

» INTRO/THANK YOU (1 MINUTE):

Thank the office for meeting with you today and reference your previous meeting.

>> HIGHLIGHT THE NEED (5 MINUTES):

We are here today because our world is currently facing the worst food crisis in 50 years.

- 45 million people—half of them children—in 43 countries are facing emergency or catastrophic levels of food insecurity, 384,000 people are already living in famine-like conditions. (Source: World Food Program)
- Climate, COVID-19, conflict, and the current crisis in Ukraine have all contributed to the looming global food crisis.
 - Climate: Weather extremes were the primary cause of hunger in 15 countries and drove around 16 million people to crisis levels of food insecurity. (Source: World. Food Program)
 - COVID-19: COVID-19 has disrupted almost every aspect of the food system hindering food transportation, slowing harvests, and reducing food affordability.
 Food prices were driven to their highest price point in a decade.
 - Conflict: Conflict is still the biggest driver of hunger, with 60 percent of the world's hungry living in areas afflicted by war and violence. (Source: World Food Program)
 - Ukraine Crisis: Ukraine and Russia provide about one third of the global wheat supply. The world is already feeling the effects of supply chain interruptions—for example, in Somalia, the price of wheat and oil has risen by 300%. (Source: Relief. Web)
- When families are hungry, they are forced to utilize desperate coping mechanisms to survive such as selling their daughters into early marriage or nulling their children out of
